ISKRA GUIDELINE DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

Purpose: Introducing evidence based guideline development and preparing the stage for ISKRA guidelines on invasive fungal infections, prostatitis and community acquired pneumonia

Over the last years, many new antifungal drugs have been launched. As in other fields of infectious disease, resistance will become a threat if these agents are not used judiciously. Rising costs are also of concern. Prostatitis and community acquired pneumonia are frequent causes for antibiotic prescribing in hospital and ambulatory care and antibiotic resistance in relevant pathogens is rising.

The Intersectoral Coordination Mechanism "Interdisciplinarna sekcija za kontrolu rezistencije na antibiotike (ISKRA)" was founded with the primary task to improve rational prescribing of antibiotics and thus preserve the efficacy of the existing antibiotics. In the past ISKRA has organized workshops for guideline development on antibiotic therapy according to the AGREE methodology with the support of international consultants. After building consensus, four guidelines have been implemented. Now the development of another set of guidelines is planned.

The aim of this meeting is to present the evidence based guideline development methodology to newly joined groups of clinicians. The Workshop will offer time for discussion to exchange knowledge and experience with eminent experts in the field from Radboud University Nijmegen and the Academic Medical Centre Amsterdam, who are members of the board of Working Party of Antibiotic Policy (SWAB), The Netherlands and the ESCMID Study group on Antibiotic Policy (ESGAP).
